The clubs have also adapted well to the challenges of the current circumstances and continue to hold virtual meetings and even through the lockdowns events and activities have been held – with many clubs for example holding Christmas sleigh activities, being involved in projects to feed people in the community and recycling IT equipment, as well as continuing to collect spectacles and distribute Message in a Bottle.

The Zone was asked by Meon Valley Lions to support a project to refurbish the resting room at Countess Mountbatten Hospice in Southampton, which was promoted to the zone clubs and many clubs have donated to this project. It was a pleasure to see the clubs working together across 2 zones to donate to this very worthwhile and important project, to help improve comfort and quality for people who are approaching or at the end of their life and their families.

Club Reports:

Crofton Lions Club

The club has continued to hold regular meetings and helped with the harvest collections for the local church, sold calendars for Love Stubbington and volunteering at Brook lane surgery with the Covid vaccination program.

Eastleigh Lions Club

Eastleigh Lions Club have held monthly directors meetings, monthly gatherings and fundraising committee meetings and recruited four possible new members.

The club has donated to local charities, including: Fledge £500, One Community £250, age concern £500, cash for kids £150, Eastleigh basics bank £150.

This is in addition to:

- Message in a bottle pop-up shop in Eastleigh shopping centre.
- Message in a bottle delivered to all local surgeries and pharmacies.
- A collection of food for Eastleigh food bank.
- Delivery of goodwill parcels to the elderly to help age concern on x 3 separate occasions.
- Street clean- out with pickers & yellow vests.
- Club volunteers also helped out with the Covid testing centre marshalling, hospital taxis, shopping for local people, collection of prescription.

Fareham Lions Club

The club has held monthly virtual meetings and kept in touch with its members to maintain their wellbeing during lockdowns. The club has been very busy through the year and has worked with local groups and organisations to help feed people within the community, particularly supported by

donations from Community First and Asda. The clubs has also supported a local disability youth football team by sponsoring their the kit with the Lions logo to assist their players in attending the finals of a competition. In addition, the club has continued to collect spectacles, distribute Message in a Bottle and made donations to overseas appeals.

The club's Christmas sleigh ran during December in a covid safe way, with the community very pleased to see Santa visiting their streets and also linked with a local school to allow Santa to visit on their last day of term.
